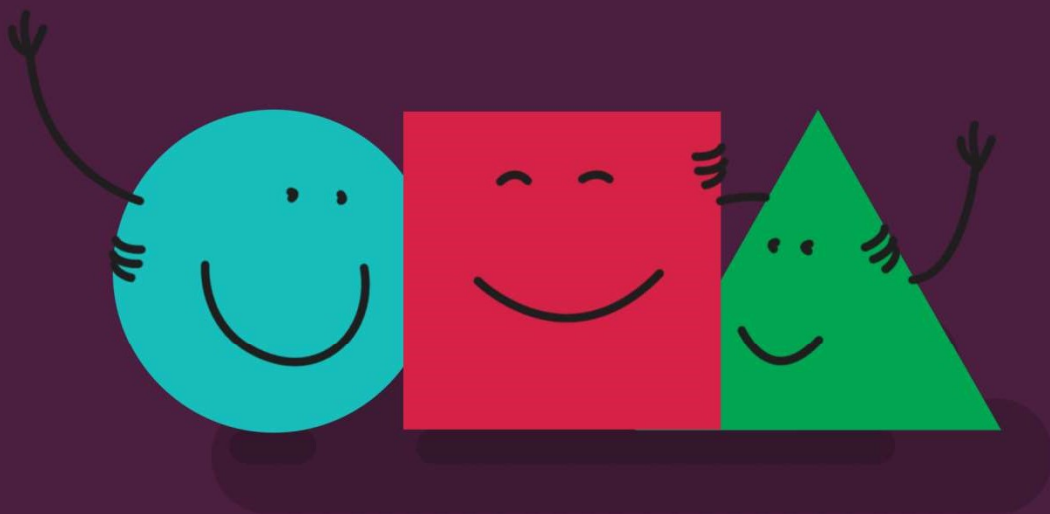

- Evidence of using psychological understanding and approaches to support practice.

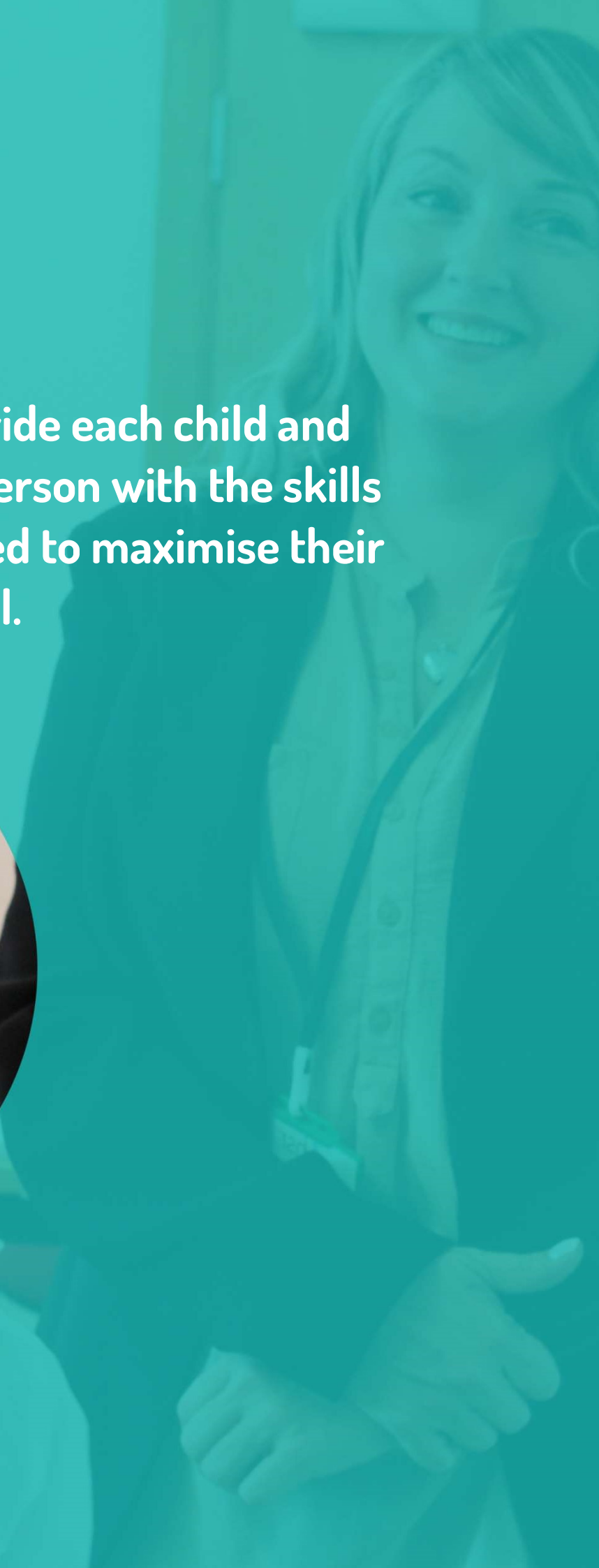

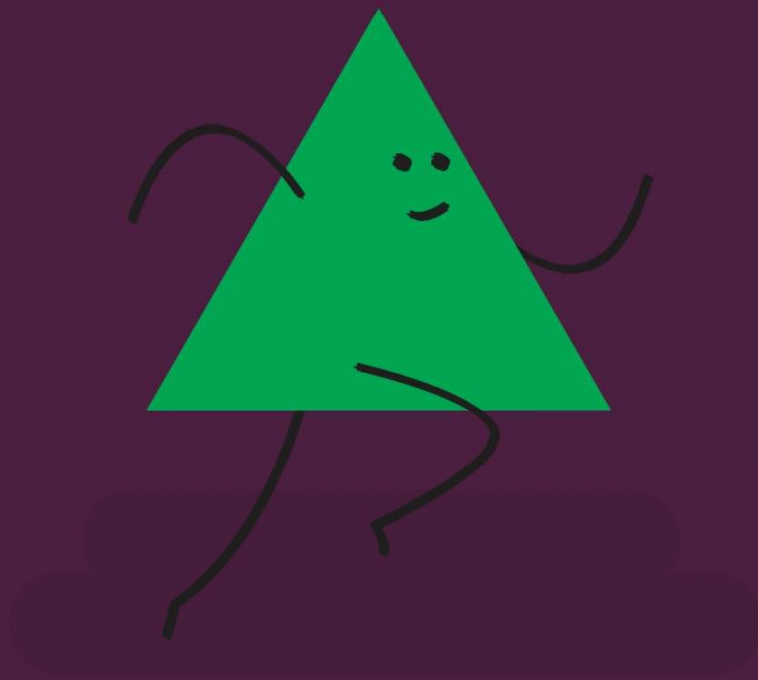
